PUBLICATION GUIDELINES

Introduction:

The Asia-Pacific Consortium of Researchers and Educators (APCORE) has partnered with reputable journals for the publication of full papers submitted for the APCORE 2022 Virtual International Conference scheduled on December 12-14, 2022. The publication partners include:

- European Online Journal of Natural and Social Sciences, ISSN: 1805-3602 (Web of Science)
- Diversidad Journal, ISSN: 2525-5215 (Web of Science)
- APCORE Online Journal of Proceedings (with ISSN)

General Guidelines for Contributors/Authors

1. The names, email addresses and affiliations of all authors should be clearly identified in the manuscript.
2. An abstract of not more than 250 words must be submitted along with the manuscript with five keywords.
3. The title of the manuscript must not be more than 20 words.
4. Make sure that corresponding author is appointed and that affiliation, ORCID Number are given for all authors.
5. The abstract must be followed by the complete manuscript.
6. Make sure that the manuscript is in the format of the Style Manual of the American Psychological Association (APA 7th Edition) both in style and citations.
7. Only manuscripts written in English (British or American) are acceptable.
8. The entire submission must be between 6000 to 9000 words.
9. It is expected that the manuscript is already thoroughly edited by English language experts.
10. The author affirms that this submission has not been previously published elsewhere in any medium.
11. Similarity index of the manuscript should not be more than 20% using Turnitin.
12. The submission file is to be in Microsoft Word document format containing the full text, references, tables, and figures.



Manuscript Arrangement

Manuscripts should be arranged as follows:

Title page. Must contain the title of the article and the name(s) and address(es) of the author(s). The full postal address, Internet e-mail address, telephone and facsimile numbers of the author who will receive correspondence and check the proofs should be included.

Abstract. This part should not exceed 250 words with listing the main results and conclusions.

Key words. It's recommended from five key words placed in alphabetical order.

Introduction. This section should include sufficient background information to set the work in context. The aims of the manuscript should be clearly stated.

Materials and methods. Provides sufficient details of the techniques employed to enable the work to be repeated.

Results. Should be presented in a logical sequence in the text, tables and figures.

Discussion. Must underline the significance of the results and place them in the context of previous research.

Conclusions. The final summarizing of the work results.

References. Should be prepared according to the instructions given below.

In the text: References must be cited in the text mentioning the last name of the author and year within parentheses (e.g. Harper, 2000). In case of two authors, both should be mentioned. When three or more authors included, mention only the first author followed by *et al* (e.g. Harper *et al.*, 2000). When two or more references are cited in the same parenthesis, the authors should be in chronological order. And if they have the same year, they should be in alphabetical order.

At the end of the article, in the **References section** the literature should be arranged in alphabetical order. Formatting of the References should follow the examples provided below:
